



On May 1 1840, the world's first postage stamp was issued. It featured the profile of the young Queen Victoria and cost one penny. Soon, other countries followed the idea and by 1874, letters were being sent all over the world by nearly every country.

The Universal Postal Union was created in Bern, Switzerland and the first World Post Day took place in 1969.

#### SUNSHINE COACHES

The Sunshine Coach Programme was created in 1962 to provide specially adapted, accessible transport for children and young people who have additional needs or are growing up in economically deprived areas.

In 2021 we delivered our 5735th Sunshine Coach, making it possible for children to get out and about so that they can learn practical life skills and enjoy trips out to places they otherwise couldn't get to.

### WHEELCHAIRS

In 2022, we provided 51 wheelchairs and accessories. Having the right wheelchair can make all the difference when it comes to being more independent, improving medical outcomes and boosting confidence.

In 2022, Variety provided grants for:

- 17 Sports wheelchairs
- 9 Powered wheelchairs
- · 6 All Terrain wheelchairs
- 18 Manual wheelchairs
- 1 Standing wheelchair




#### EQUIPMENT GRANTS

Through our Equipment Grants Programme, we have helped more than 1,400 families and organisations across the country.

Our equipment grants include funding for sports, sensory and play equipment. We also fund hoists and orthopaedic furniture for children at home.

In 2021, we supplied 107 equipment grants.



For disadvantaged children, a day out can become a cherished memory. Each year we take thousands of children to all sorts of venues.

In 2021, Variety partnered with 84 schools, youth and community arganisations to take 10,533 children on a Variety Great Day Out.
